



























Ragpickers threaten stir stir A Reporter Nehru Stadium

THE raquickers' association has warned of a state-wide agitation if the provisions of the unprotected workers' Act were not enforced within a month.

Mohan Nanaware, president of the Kagad Kach Patra Kashtakari Panchayat (KKPKP ragpickers association), told the Pune Times that state labour minister Sabir Shalkh had made a "non-serious" promise of introducing a law that would cover the rappickers. Shaikh made the statement during a convention held here on Thursday.

Nanaware said the ragpickers would conduct a huge morcha in Mumbai and also court arrest if their demand was not accepted by the state government. "It is ulti-

mately a question of survival for the 2.5-lakh ragpickers in the state," he commented.

Nanaware said the association was trying to mobilise 75,000 ragpickers from Mumbai and about 10,000 from Pune. He pointed out that 90 per cent of the ragpickers were women, most of whom belonged to the Dalit and other scheduled castes. This workforce segregated as much as 300 tonnes of garbage every day in the city, he added.

Referring to the Surat pattern for ragpickers initiated by the Gujarat government, Nanaware said the Surat-based Seva Dham organisation had successfully demanded that labour laws be made aplicable to the rappickers too.

The ragpickers' movement was gaining strength, said Nanaware, adding that in Mumbai the agitation for seeking identity-cards for this workforce was initiated by RPI leader Ramdas Athawale. However, he lamented that despite the initial push, the agitation was not sustained.

Earlier, during the convention, Shaikh assured that he would sympathetically consider the demands of the ragpickers' association. He also agreed to hold a dialogue with Dr Baba Adhav on the issues of provident fund, medical and other statutory benefits for the rappickers. Contributions to these ben'efits would be made by the scrap traders and the government, he said.



Average Weights of Garbage Collected Daily in Pune




Actual Average Weights (3 Day Survey)

A city agrees to pay medical bills of those who clean it up

Pune corporation to offer medical insurance to ragpickers after an ILO study and a unique campaign

OF the estimated 1,000 tonnes of trash that this city generates every day, they pick up 250 tonnes. Finally, the Pune Municipal Corporation (PMC) has acknowledged the role played by its 3,650 registered ragpickers and in what

jamin, the decision is awaiting final clearance from the standing committee. "I have cleared the docket for 3000 odd ragpickers and set aside Rs 2.5 lakhs," Benjamin told The Sunday Express.

The ragpickers will get an annual cover of Rs 5,000 per head with the civic body picking up the tab for the premiums. The bill, says New India Assurance Co. Ltd comes to a neat Rs 2.78 lakhs — a small

amount considering the contribution made by them in keeping the city clean.

"They lift nearly 200 tons of garbage everyday and are exposed to hazardous diseases. This will ensure that they get in-patient care in hospitals," says Benjamin.

Benjamin's landmark decision comes two years after an International Labour Organisation study and a unique programme of advocacy by the ragpickers themselves.

The ILO study identified Pune ragpickers as a highrisk group prone to health hazards. Earning Rs 30 per head per day, ragpickers are vulnerable to TB, respiratory

problems, muscular-skeletal problems, scabies and other skin diseases.

The ILO study was conducted by Poornima Chikermane, Lakshmi Narayan and Medha Deshpande, associated with the SNDT College's department of adult education.

The study covered 252 scrap collectors and 72 scrap traders.

The association started lobbying with the PMC two years ago for the medical insurance. The association also lobbied with housing societies to allow ragpickers to pick up garbage from the homes for a monthly charge of Rs 20.
